



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Treasurer's Report

The 2010 fiscal year ended September 30 is now wrapped up and our auditors, KPMG – Calgary are now in the midst of the annual review.

In September I reported that our rental operations were on pace to exceed 2009, but there has been some fall-off in the last quarter which left us at roughly the same levels as last year; gross rentals of about \$64,000. Still, this operation is a major contributor to our overall financial well being, providing a net contribution (after direct rental costs) of roughly \$20,000 per year.

We continue to generate an overall loss on our social events, despite the hard work of the many volunteers who contribute so much of their time to ensure enjoyment for us all at these events. In response to concern over this trend a committee of the Board has been struck to review all aspects of these events and report to the Board on ways to lessen the impact of the losses over the long term. Some bright spots:

- Proceeds from the June casino netted \$70,794
- The Gibson Petroleum donation of \$5,050 to the Building Fund brought total donations to over \$6,000 for the year.
- The building fund continues to recover from the beating it took in late 2008; up about 4% in market value during the fiscal year.

We are in an enviable financial position with cash and investments of \$540,000, including the Memorial Building Fund with a value of \$285,000.

Once again I must say thank you to the many volunteers who give so much of their time to ensure a timely and accurate reporting for proceeds from our many activities.

2011 Stampede Display


The Stampede Display Committee (Bud Vine, Dave Wake, Jim McDonald, Ian Campbell, Mike Stewart) have started planning the SAPD display at the 2011 Calgary Stampede.

Our application to the Stampede for a booth and funding has been submitted. We understand that our booth may be re-located into the Western Oasis (western art exhibit) area of the BMO Centre.

As in previous years, the display will be centered around 400 or so photos from SAPD's collection. We received very good response at this year's Stampede to the theme featuring the main street of southern Alberta towns in the late 1800s/early 1900s. We are in the process of acquiring 24–30 additional photos from the Glenbow Archives of some additional towns and villages to augment our collection. SAPD will be, again, collaborating with the Calgary Stampede's Historical Committee in the display. The CS Historical Committee expects to feature historical photos celebrating the 50th anniversary of the CS Stampede Ranch. Importantly, the CS Historical Committee will again provide some volunteers to staff the display.



Building Committee Report

We started out the New Year in January with a number of Building Committee members gathering to empty all of the kitchen cabinets and placing contents on tables in the main hall. From there until the end of February we proceeded to carry out renovations, in particular:

- Replaced the flooring in both kitchens, front entrance and the upstairs washrooms.
- The upstairs kitchen cupboards were all sanded and the surfaces refinished. In addition new locks were installed providing one key fits all.
- Kitchen island was rotated to a more serviceable position and was revamped to hold pull out trays for the cutlery.
- Upstairs washrooms were completely renovated to include new

flooring, sink and toilet fixtures, new cedar ceilings and walls were applicable. Drywall that was covering the original logs was removed, restoring a more rustic appearance.

• Scrapped the small fridge and replaced with a closed cupboard to hold the garbage cans.

In the midst of all of this a water tank decided to let loose during the night, resulting in six inches of water in the main basement area. As a result the floor was completely replaced to match the upstairs and downstairs kitchen. Fortunately, this replacement was covered by our insurance.

All of the foregoing, save for the basement flooring, cost \$54,218. And after a City of Calgary grant the net was \$43,060.

In addition we disposed of the large white fridge and replaced it with a new stainless steel model. We also replaced both water tanks which were both overdue.

That is how we spent the last Casino monies.

On May 2nd we had our work detail with 22 members showing up to lend their efforts in our annual spring cleanup. As usual a great job done by all.

Looking ahead we plan to:

- Immediately replace the kitchen window together with the south office window.
- Our next major project would be

to have cast iron automatic gates installed at the front entrance.

Our Custodian, Sherry Toffin, continues to do a great job in maintaining the rentals despite the economy.

My thanks to the Building Committee members: Ernie Rice, Herm Thielen, Peggy Barr, Dave Wake, Buster Schweiger, Bob Brewster, Joe Ferguson, Beryl Sibbald, Bill Nelson, Fran Copithorne and President Moyra for giving freely of their time, energy and their valuable advice and guidance. With a very special thank you to Karen (Copithorne) Iredale for lending her Interior Design expertise during our renovations.

Thank you to the Board of Directors of both the Association and the Foundation for their continued support of the Building Committee's recommendations.
