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Treasurer's Report

From the financial perspective I think this year, 2011, has been successful. Following are some highlights:

- The \$50,000 bequest from the estate of Evelyn Calow was received by us in July. These funds will be directed to specific upgrades and improvements for the Memorial Building. The Board of Directors will review recommendations from the building committee for projects to be funded and these will be appropriately recognized as having been funded by the Evelyn Calow estate.
- Rental revenues have been excellent for the first nine months of the fiscal year and are nearly \$7,500 ahead of last year. In addition, June saw record

revenue of nearly \$14,000 and July earned us \$9,785.

- With the exception of the costs related to the installation of the new lift there have been no large unexpected or unusual expenditures.
- The audits have been completed and will be presented to the Boards in September for approval.
- As of June 30, 2011 our Memorial Building Fund investments had more than fully recovered from the 2008/2009 down turn and throughout have continued to produce a yield of nearly 3%.

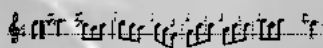
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Historic Calgary Week and the Southern Alberta Pioneers

The opening ceremonies for Historic Calgary Week were held the morning of July 22 at the Memorial Building of the Southern Alberta Pioneers. This year Calgary Mayor Naheed Nenshi officiated at the opening by welcoming those attending and by reading the City of Calgary Historic Calgary Week Proclamation. In his remarks the Mayor praised the volunteers who work to plan and carry out HCW, and those who make presentations. He told the crowd that he was impressed with the variety in the ten-day program and that there were several sessions that he particularly wanted to attend. For the mayor, at the top of his list was a noon-hour presentation by Don Smith, "Calgary's Grand Year 1912."

Often politicians express thoughts such as this knowing that in the busy day-to-day activities these wishes sometimes have to be set aside. But on Thursday at Central United Church the Mayor arrived, bag lunch in hand, and joined the large crowd gathered to hear the HCW talk. The Mayor concluded his remarks with praise for the Southern Alberta Pioneers for their efforts to tell the stories of the people who made their lives in early Alberta.

The *Calgary Herald* sent their feature article writer, Valerie Fortney to report on the morning presentations. This led to an article based on the presentations by Alexander (Sandy) Dean about his grandfather, Major Alexander Boswell Stafford (from the Lethbridge area), and Catherine Munn Smith, great granddaughter of Walter and Janet Moodie (of the Glenbow area). Fortney reported from "The Southern Alberta Pioneers Memorial Building, a beautiful log house-style structure that sits on a hill in the inner city, with a spectacular view of the Rockies."

In the afternoon, Pioneer's association president, Dave Wake told about his grandfather Walter Wake and Peggy Robertson Barr reported on the three generations of the Robertson family in

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2011 Calgary Stampede Display

Once again, this year's display was another success. The move into the Western Oasis, the 100,000 square feet of space in Halls D and E of the BMO Centre which is totally dedicated to exhibits of Western art and lifestyles, was very well received by visitors and volunteers alike. Our second year of collaborating with the Calgary Stampede Historical Committee also worked extremely well and greatly assisted with staffing the display.

As in previous years, SAPD's photo display consists of 300+ photos from the SAPD collection. For the 2011 display, we added 20 or so photos from circa 1912, in anticipation of the upcoming 100th anniversary of the Calgary Stampede in 2012. We continue to feature the main streets of southern Alberta towns in the late 1800s/early 1900s.

Some 350+ people signed the guest book, including visitors from across Canada, outside of Canada including several states in the U.S. (Texas, North Dakota, South Dakota, Colorado, Vermont, West Virginia, Washington, California, Illinois) and several international points (England, Scotland, Northern Ireland, France, Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, Belgium, Hungary, Czech Republic, Mauritius). The comments in the guest book were uniformly positive on the display. While it was tucked in the back of the Western Oasis, the booth seemed to get a lot of traffic, albeit less than the location in the Stampede Market. The traffic we did get was better – for the most part, folks genuinely were interested in southern Alberta history.

Similar to last year, we had a vehicle on loan from the Remington Carriage Museum in Cardston. While the replica "Western Passenger Wagon" was of interest, it was positioned away from and somewhat disconnected with our display. The Stampede's safety folks also deemed the stagecoach unsafe to get in and out of which detracted from the photo opportunity that had been very popular in past years. The Committee is thinking about how we can rectify this situation.

We received considerable "soft" financial support from the Calgary Stampede Western Showcase Committee in the form of a new booth, the display space and day passes for the SAPD vol-

unteers. The support was not only for the 2011 Stampede but has been committed going forward.

A big thank you to Jim McDonald from SAPD as well as Linda Clarkson and Kate Gernat from the Calgary Stampede Historical Committee for their time spent on the phone filling the approximate 90 time slots required to staff the booth for the 11 days. This is a big and important task. Also thanks to Dave Wake, Bud Vine, Ian Campbell and Bill Murphy.

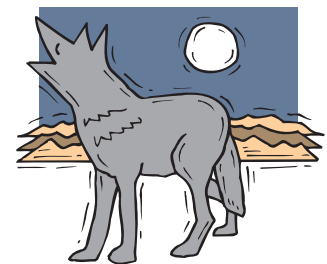
