In 1922 the Southern Alberta Pioneers and Old Timers Association were established as a Social and Benevolent Society. In reviewing the bylaws this year, I have been impressed by how we continue to be true to the objectives of the original constitution. We can all feel proud to be associated with such a vibrant, deeply rooted organization. As the end of my term approaches, I feel honoured to have been able to do my part to carry forward past endeavours. The present bylaws with their focus on social events, historical activities and the preservation of the Memorial Building remain true to the original intent.



Treasurer's Report

In the April newsletter I made comment on several very positive matters affecting our finances which I would like to briefly follow up on.

Construction and installation of the new gate is complete and the work is fully paid for. Construction came in on budget and as a result we have nearly \$6000.00 left over from the original Rintoul gift of \$50,000.00. This will be carried forward on our books and be used as necessary for future maintenance and upgrading as required.

Secondly, at mid-year our rental operation appeared to be on a record pace. However, since then things have somewhat flattened out to the point where we are now (July 31), running about \$5000.00 behind last year. There doesn't seem to be any specific reason, simply not as many renters compared to last year. I should also note that June and July of 2011 were near record months and so I suppose it is not surprising that there has been some fall off.

Since the end of September last year, our fiscal year end, there has been over \$4000.00 donated to the Memorial Building Fund, in memory of deceased members. The investment of these donations and the earnings on the already existing funds brings our total Building Fund to nearly \$ 330,000.00. Although the return on these investments, like all investments these days, remain very low but steady.

Although others will be reporting on the Stampede BBQ, I thought it would be worth noting that over the past few years there has been great progress made towards turning this wonderful event into a break-even position. Due this year to a higher turnout (245 attendees) and a higher level of bar patronage, the deficit was reduced by a further \$800.00 this year to \$1800.00.

We remain in an enviable positive cash position and on a solid financial footing.

Hosting the Opening Ceremonies

Historic Calgary Week - July 27 to August 6, 2012

The Memorial Building of the Southern Alberta Pioneers and their Descendants once again served as the meeting place for the opening day of Historic Calgary Week (HCW) on July 27, 2012. And once again, His Worship the Mayor of Calgary, Naheed Nenshi was in attendance to welcome participants and to read the City of Calgary proclamation about HCW. With obvious enthusiasm for the work done by the Chinook Country Historic Society and SAPD historic committee, the Mayor had checked back to historic sources to discover several recipes used by pioneers --- some quite straightforward, others a bit obscure, but none-the-less interesting. He continued by praising the pleasant times he has at the Stampede Pioneer Teas, and the warm welcome given. The mayor promised to try to attend some of the HCW programs, and later was successful in being at one lunch-hour presentation at the Central United Church (topic: The Barron Building).

The Pioneer Lady, Joan Davis, historian at SAPD, and Pioneer Gentleman Bud Vine were in attendance during the day.

The first presentation of the day was given by Brenda Fox Gladstone, about her grandfather, James Gladstone, the first aboriginal senator in Canada. She provided an in-sight to Gladstone's background and accomplishments, but also used the opportunity to acknowledge the contributions of Gladstone descendants as leaders in administration of tribal affairs, the Indian Affairs department, and in education at the Blood Nation in Cardston. Several members of Brenda's family attended the program.

"The Five Homes of Colonel James Macleod" was the topic for the second presentation when Nancy Townshend, a great grand-daughter discussed the family home on the Isle of Skye in Scotland, the rural setting of the home near Toronto (now part of the city), Fort Macleod, the ranch near Pincher Creek, and the Calgary home (now as a replica at Heritage Park, Calgary). She also wanted to set straight the historical record about the meaning of the name 'Calgary.' When Colonel Irvine wrote about the

naming of Fort Calgary, he cites a meaning of "clear running water." Nancy informed us that Calgary comes from the Gaelic word meaning "bay farm," and that indeed Macleod may have thought directly of his childhood home, a bay farm on the west coast of Skye, when he suggested the name Calgary. Nancy hopes that artist Stan Phelps will be commissioned to paint a different mural at City Hall, showing Colonel Macleod family's bay farm rather than the different island, different bay, different farm it presently shows.

Celebration of the declaration of Calgary as the Cultural Capital of Canada was acknowledged with a special cake. As cake and ice-cream were served on special picnic occasions in the past, the tradition was continued. Pioneer Lady, Joan Davis and SAPD President, Kathleen Rogers cut the 2012 Celebration Cake.

The afternoon session featured pioneer JJ McHugh, rancher and instructor at the Fish Creek Agriculture School. As an aside, the HCW brochure displayed a photo of a picnic on the banks of the Elbow River, likely in an area near the Memorial Building. Only with further research was it discovered the coincidence that the photograph featured the McHugh family. Storyteller Karen Gummo told the McHugh story in prose and song, featuring audience participation, using the documents entrusted to her by JJ McHugh's grand-daughter, Virginia Klatzel. Four generations of the McHugh families were in attendance.

"Calgary of the 1940s" was the topic of the fourth session featuring some of the many treasures collected by William

(Bill) McLennan. Before the program began, when an ancient rolled map was hung at the front of the room, audience members flocked to see it up close, so keen was the interest. Bill "walked" the audience up and down the main streets of downtown Calgary citing the various buildings and businesses. As he recounted his boyhood adventures and reminisces, he also discussed the excitement of the Grey Cup and the politics involving the Social Credit and Conservative eras. Many in the audience shared in these memories of the 1940s.

This event represents the seventh year that the Southern Alberta Pioneers have been part of the Historic Calgary Week. Participation by SAPD honours the organization's mandate to tell and keep alive the stories of the founding pioneers.


Stampede Parade 2012

Calgary Stampede Display - 2012

Once again the display was a success. The move into the Western Oasis (this was our 2nd year at this location) was very well received by visitors and volunteers alike. Our 3rd year of collaborating with the Calgary Stampede Historical Committee (CSHC) also went well and greatly assisted with booth setup, staffing and take down at the end of the stampede.

As in previous years, the photo display consisted of approximately 400 photos from the SAPD and CSHC collections. For the 2012 display, we added photos of early Calgary including the Calgary Stampede as well as surrounding areas circa 1912 to join the Calgary Stampede in celebrating its 100th anniversary. Thanks to Al Collins for allowing us to copy the 46 inch long picture (including names) of the North West Mounted Police assembled on horseback at the 1912 Stampede. His grandfather, W.F. Parker, was one of the troop. Also thanks to Dave and Anne Brown for donating an original poster advertising Guy Weadick's Stampede Ranch west of Longview.

Many visitors signed the guest book as well as commented in the three ringed binder. The committee will be following up on inquiries, etc. as soon as possible. Similar to last year, the Remington Carriage Museum loaned the stagecoach or more properly called the Western Passenger Wagon. It was positioned away from and somewhat disconnected from our display due to fire regulations, etc. Stairs were built and a third volunteer staffed most time slots to assist entry and exit of visitors wanting to get their picture taken in the unit.

The stairs and the extra volunteers were at the request of the Stampede to meet safety requirements. We received considerable support from the Western Showcase Committee to erect the booth, supply and install lights, provide day passes, etc. Many thanks to Susan Tomilson and her staff in the Western Oasis. Thanks also go to Jim McDonald from SAPD, Kate Gernat as well as Linda Clarkson from the CSHC for their time spent on the phone filling all the time slots required to staff the booth for eleven days.
