
Stampede Display Future



Davisburg District School No. 79 N.W.T. Two New Books

The Davisburg area is one of the oldest communities in the province. It had a Post Office long before DeWinton, Okotoks and High River. The first Post Office opened in 1888 with T.H. Andrews as the Postmaster, followed in 1896 by John Nash, followed by M. Stewart. C.K.K. Patterson was the final Post Master when the office was closed in 1916.

The area, originally called Glenbeg after the Begg family that lived in the "Glen", was changed in 1887 to Davis Burg after Donald Watson Davis, the first member of the Canadian House of Commons from Macleod (N.W.T.), 1887-1895.

Davisburg School Dristrict was #79 in the North West Territories. The first school, built in 1888, was located on NE 1/4 29-21-28-W4 and later moved to the NE 1/4 30-21-28-W4 in 1897. In 1908 it was moved again. A new school was built; the original school was then used as a stable. In 1913 a teacherage was built and in 1914 it was attached to the school. Later this addition was used as a kitchen. The school served the families in the Davisburg district from 1888 until its final closure in 1955.

To commemorate the history of the school district and of a proud community built in the spirit by people dedicated to their heritage, a plaque designed by Paul Kalnassy and engraved by Anton Perzinger was unveiled. An image of the oneroom rural school house is situated in the upper left hand corner of the plaque, which is hung on the outside of what is now the Davisburg Community Hall.
